

Hi Claire,

I see that someone from our team has replied to your email but unfortunately, I was not copied into the reply.

Hopefully, you will have been advised to contact the Safer Roads Partnership for any updates that they might have for you.

The update from the Police / SNT is that I have carried out speed enforcement on the Rednal straight 3 or 4 times over the last few weeks and, bearing in mind that the road in question has a national speed limit of 60mph, the highest speed I have recorded was 63mph by a car. Tractors often get accused of travelling at 45 - 50mph along the straight and through the surrounding lanes (even though they are mechanically restricted to a max of approx 30mph) but the highest speed I have recorded for a tractor on the straight is 32mph.

You also have to bear in mind that once I have been stood at the side of the road with my speed gun for 10 minutes or so, drivers start to warn each other that I am about and so alter their speed accordingly.

Rednal straight is approx 1.7 miles long from the Queens Head pub to where the road bends and splits at the top. The spot where I park / stand, which is the most appropriate for correctly using the speed device and also the safest place for me to stand, is nowhere near any houses so I'm not surprised that the resident you refer to has not seen me when I'm there.
